Introduction

TB-CAPT (Close the gap, increase Access, Provide adequate Therapy) will provide evidence for impactful implementation of tuberculosis (TB) and TB/HIV co-infection diagnostic strategies, including drug-susceptibility testing through a series of trials in Tanzania, Mozambique, and South Africa.

TB-CAPT is funded by the European and Developing Countries Clinical Trials Partnership (EDCTP) and will run for 3.5 years, with planned completion in 2023.

The project is coordinated by FIND, the global alliance for diagnostics (Switzerland,) and managed by LINQ management GmbH (Germany).

Logo Clear Zone

USING THE LOGO ON IMAGE BACKGROUNDS

- 1. The colour version of the logo can be used over visuals, on their clearest part not to compromise legibility.
- 2. When the background compromises legibility, use the logo on a white strip under the visual.


Secondary Colours & Colour Usage



POMEGRANATE & ORANGE

Pomegranate and Orange are two accent colours, to be used sparingly. They are intended to identify or highlight an item or specific information on a page.

TWO-COLOUR STRIPES

Graduated two-colour strips serve as heading bands in a chart to delineate an image. The two colours blend at the centre of the strip. The creation and use of these strips are a matter of art direction, to be decided by a professional.


